How to Help:

- Pick a Goal: How many books can we collect? Decide where they will go—maybe a school, a shelter, or a community center.
- Drop-off Spots: Set up book collection boxes at school, the library, or a community center. Don't forget to decorate the boxes!
- Spread the Word: Tell friends, teachers, and neighbors!
- Make It Fun! Set a challenge—maybe the group that donates the most books wins a fun prize or a special reading day!



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Bookmark Making

Goal: Create awesome, colorful bookmarks to go with donated books!

How to Help:

- Grab Your Supplies: Use paper, markers, stickers, glitter, ribbons—anything to make your bookmark special.
- Get Creative: Design a bookmark with a fun quote about books, a cool drawing, or a pattern inspired by your favorite story!
- Bookmark Station: Set up a table at school, the library, or an event so kids can craft their bookmarks together.
- Share Your Creations: Once finished, bookmarks can be given out with donated books or handed out as a thank-you to everyone who helps!

Where to Donate:

- Schools & Libraries Support classrooms, libraries, and after-school programs in underserved areas.
- Hospitals & Shelters Brighten a child's day by donating to children's hospitals, homeless shelters, and family shelters.
- Foster Care Programs Provide books to kids in foster care who may not have their own.
- Community Centers & First Responders Donate to local community centers, fire stations, and police departments, where books can be shared with kids in need.
